

Biography

Nancy Terrill is a native Ohioan. After graduating with honors with a degree in International Business from Lake Erie College and Universidad de Salamanca, Spain in 1978, she began her corporate banking Career at the Cleveland Trust Company, then the 13th largest bank in the country. She quickly rose through the Credit Department and worked in Correspondent Banking before becoming the youngest VP in the bank's history in the Middle Market Lending Department. Wanting to expand her background in corporate banking, she moved to start up a Healthcare Lending Department at the bank while earning her MBA at night, graduating with honors. Four years later she took advantage of a Commercial Loan Workout opportunity at the bank where she managed small and large workout opportunities including several large multi-bank transactions.

Nancy was hired away by Citibank's Leveraged Capital Lending Division, working on large leveraged buyout transactions in 1989. Later her former employer (now Keybank) hired her back to run a team in the Commercial Loan Workout Department focused on the largest, most complicated transactions in the portfolio. Over the following 10 years she rose to Regional Division Head, then National Manager of the Special Assets Group responsible for 130 employees in 12 domestic offices, handling a \$3 billion loan portfolio of problem loans.

Ms. Terrill left banking in 2003 to join a New York based restructuring boutique consulting company, working on bank support for large workout situations, along with several middle market situations. Based on her automotive workout expertise, she was hired by Grant Thornton in their Detroit office to assist with several high profile workout consulting projects, assisting an automotive OEM client to maintain their supply chain. She moved within Grant Thornton to the M&A Due Diligence Transaction Advisory Support Division, assisting private equity and strategic buyers in their acquisition due diligence.

While at Grant Thornton a number of lawyers familiar with her background as a workout banker referred her for expert witness projects in bank litigation. She has worked on several of these projects each year since then, providing her law firm clients with focused rebuttal and expert witness insight. She has extensive experience in writing expert witness reports for both State and Federal court cases, and has given deposition testimony on those cases.

Ms. Terrill is now employed as a Managing Director at Inglewood Associates, providing restructuring and profit improvement advice to middle market companies in addition to the expert witness projects. Ms. Terrill is a Certified Turnaround Professional (CTP), a past president of TMA Ohio (Turnaround Management Association), and currently active as a board member of Cleveland Rape Crisis Center and Lake Erie College.
